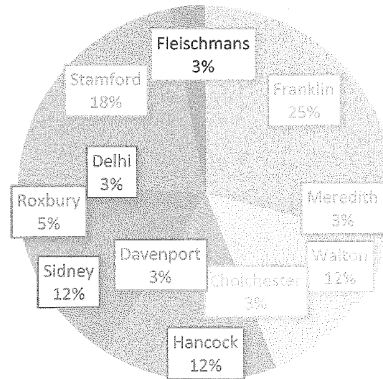
Stacy Green, Program Director of The Delaware County Public Health gave a presentation on lead cases in the county. There are 34 active cases in the county compared to 26 cases last year. The Town of Stamford has the second most active cases with 6 cases. The Town of Franklin has the most active cases with 9 active cases. Brochures were provided and will be on display at the town office to provide education to the community.

Current case load of active lead cases: Totals 34 cases.

ACTIVE CASES



- Out of 34 active cases the Town of Stamford has the second most active cases with 6 active cases. The Town of Franklin has the most active case with 9 active case.
- Lead sources: Homes built/painted prior to 1978. Lead will stay where it is but if disturbed through renovations can be moved around into the home environment, water, and even the dirt. Lead is most harmful to small children, babies and to pregnant women. Lead can be absorbed into children's bodies and can even effect an unborn child.
- Effects of lead poisoning: *Behavioral problems *Growth problems *Lower IQ
*Anemia *Kidney damage * Hearing loss *Death
- **Negative lead effects are not reversible!**
- Delaware County Public Health recommends educating the community on ways to renovate safe. Delaware County Public Health also recommends to get children who may be at risk of lead poisoning or who are between the ages of 1-2 years old to get tested for lead poisoning.

Supv. Kosier informed the board of an approved grant in the amount of \$100,000. from the Robinson-Broadhurst Foundation, Inc. toward a town truck replacement. Discussed were options of the two-year grant and using the grant funds as a down payment and ordering a new truck. Hwy. Supt. Ballard has an estimate for a Western Star truck and will try to obtain an estimate for a Mac truck. A decision will be made next month as to which truck to order.

Hwy. Supt. Jonathan Ballard gave the following highway report:

- Rich Rd. was pug milled on May 19th and 20th. We had 13 trucks from 4 different towns assisting us. The shared services agreement makes a big difference when you need the help. One highway employee will be on vacation for 2 weeks and another will be on vacation for 1 week.
- We began working on shoulders on Rich Rd. on June 1st. We got the material out of Clark's gravel bank for a short haul. We want to thank Del. Co. DPW for helping us.
- Been working on Scutt Mt. Rd., grading and rolling is done.
- Will start grader patch on June 7th, weather permitting on Madison Hill Rd. and then on to Narrow Notch Rd.

Correspondence was received from the Grace family thanking Hwy. Supt. Ballard and crew for the resurfacing of Rich Rd.

RESOLUTION NO. 15-2021 WAS INTRODUCED BY Daniel Deysenroth and seconded by Brent Trimbell:

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that we accept the Local Flood Analysis ("LFA") findings which was completed last year. The LFA had specific recommendations for the Village of Hobart and Village of Stamford, related specifically to undersized culvert replacements that could be enlarged to reduce flowing. The LFA didn't find potential flood mitigations projects in the Hamlet of South Kortright, there are findings and some general recommendations in the report.
