To the Members of the Town Board:

On February 9, 2022 Town Board Member Daniel Deysenroth and Supervisor John Kosier audited the books of Town Justice Jacqueline Lamport. Our audit consisted of random testing's of different areas of the Court procedures.

<u>Fines</u>

We reviewed fines collected in the months of July, September and November of 2021, tracking the fines to the current software program utilized by the Justice court. Our review included fines paid by cash, check and credit card. Deposit slips and bank statements for the selected dates were compared against the Justice generated report for accuracy. We also checked the date of receipt of fine money for timely deposit into the Justice account. We did not observe any deficiencies in the handling of fines.

Bail and Petty Cash

We reviewed the Bail Account for open items and proper disposition of bail and the Petty Cash account for verification of cash used. We did not observe any deficiencies in the handling of bail or Petty Cash.

Credit Card Receipts

We reviewed credit card activity for both the former and current credit card providers and found no deficiencies.

Monthly Reports

We reviewed the monthly report to the State for the month of November 2020 and tracked to the December 2021 Supervisors report for accuracy. We observed no deficiencies.

Our audit was not designed to form an opinion of all internal controls in place by the Town Justice Court.
